They turned the table on that low expectation when they emerged the section champions and earned a ticket to the USTA Nationals in Arizona by beating Coachella Valley, Ventura, and San Fernando Valley.

2017 USTA Mixed 18 & Over Doubles League Entry Deadline - December 10 (No Exceptions)

The 2017 USTA 18 & Over Mixed Doubles League team registration deadline for a minimum of six players including the captain is Thursday, December 10, before 8:59 PM.

Offered at the 6.0, 7.0, 8.0, 9.0, and 10.0 NTRP *Combo* Levels, the format is three doubles. Teams must have a minimum of six players (maximum of 12). *Combo* means the sum of the NTRP ratings of an individual team cannot exceed the level of play and no more than 1.0 point may separate the partners. Season begins in January on Saturday afternoons.

No registrations allowed before the 2016 Year End Ratings are published online at www.usta.com usually at the beginning of December. Captains should select their team members with the understanding that the Year End Ratings could impact individuals. Team captains can receive their team registration numbers by calling Lesley at 858-755-8110 as soon as the Year End Ratings are published, they have checked for players' rating changes, and have six committed players.

USTA FLEX LEAGUE

For singles players who want to practice or polish their skills the USTA FLEX League which is more like a ladder fits the bill. It's also a great way for players new to San Diego County to meet others who enjoy singles. Five seasons are offered: Winter, Spring, Summer, Fall, and Holiday. Players choose either San Diego or San Diego North County and also select their skill level when registering online. Once the suggested schedule is published all have access to the other players' contact information in their flight. Opponents mutually agree to a time and date to play their match. Men's and women's flights are offered at 2.5, 3.0, 3.5, 4.0, 4.5, and 5.0 NTRP skill levels. MATCH SCORES ARE NOT INCLUDED IN THE NTRP RATING DATABASE used for the USTA Adult and Mixed League teams. (For USTA five-line leagues that require two singles individual matches, the Winter season is great practice for your team's singles players.) Fee is \$35; USTA members save \$10. Wounded Warrior Tennis Program Continues to Grow Through Free Weekly Clinics By Steve Kappes



For the past seven years, the District's Wounded Warrior Tennis Program has been using tennis as a means of rehabilitation and community reintegration to improve the lives of wounded, ill, and injured service members and veterans. It may be best known for its annual camps which bring together warriors from all over the country for an all-expense paid week of tennis instruction and camaraderie every May.

The program is much more than that, however. The program runs year-round for local wounded, ill, and injured veterans and service members through free tennis clinics held at Balboa Tennis Club every week, and at Naval Medical Center San Diego every other week. The clinics have been growing in popularity; approximately 20-25 participants come to each one.

The instruction at both locations is led by Balboa Tennis Club's Tennis Director Geoff Griffin, assisted by volunteers from the tennis community. Carly Hanna, a recent graduate from Pepperdine University who relocated to San Diego, loves giving back through this program. She writes:

"The San Diego Wounded Warrior tennis clinic has taken off in recent months. As a fairly new volunteer, I've seen why. You're immediately pulled in by the energy and you stay for the community. The courts serve as a safe space for improving tennis players as well as a break from the priorities and pressures of everyday life. With our number of participants on the rise, we're able to arrange doubles matches and large group games, such as king (or queen) of the court. And as much as players show up to boost their tennis skills, they also bring such enthusiastic and optimistic spirit that brings joy to everyone they encounter. This clinic is a true community that is meeting its goals to encourage an active lifestyle and foster meaningful friendships."

Rankings in Review

In our yearbook and at sandiegotennis.com we publish our annual rankings from the calendar year.

To be eligible for a ranking in Men's Open, NTRP, and age group *singles* divisions, a minimum of *three* SDDTA sanctioned tournaments played during the calendar year with at least two wins (not counting defaults) is required. To be eligible for a ranking in Women's Open, NTRP, and age group singles divisions, a minimum of *two* SDDTA sanctioned tournaments played during the calendar year with at least one win (not counting defaults) is required.

To be eligible for a ranking in the Open, NTRP, and age group doubles divisions (Men's, Women's, Mixed, or Family), a minimum of two SDDTA sanctioned tournaments played during the calendar year with at least one win (not counting defaults) is required. If there are insufficient opportunities for enough players to meet the minimum requirements in a division, the committee may choose to relax the requirements.

Any player or team that meets requirements for a ranking is eligible as long as they are a current USTA member, regardless of their residency. As rankings are published in the yearbook, space limitations may not allow all eligible players in a division to be ranked.

We use the ranking system developed by the USTA to compile our initial rankings. The system bases its rankings on a combination of head-to-head results and how far one progresses in a tournament, with higher weights given to tournaments that have the larger draws. All players should check the accuracy of their tournament results so that all of their results are evaluated correctly by the ranking committee. Club Liaison Committee Surveys Local Tennis Clubs

The SDDTA Club Liaison Committee was formed earlier this year to improve communications between the District and tennis clubs within the District. Our hope is that we can establish a network of resources that will better enable the District and our local tennis clubs to identify and address common issues. As a first step in order to gather basic facts about our local clubs and identify common concerns, the SDDTA recently mailed a survey form to local clubs.

The SDDTA survey requested general information from each club including contact information, number of members or memberships, the type of club (private or public), the number of courts, and whether the courts are in a public park (and the club is therefore affected by city permitting processes). We also asked each club to rank various areas of concern to identify common issues. These areas included membership growth, financial issues, solar power or LED lighting installation, promoting member activities and tournaments, identifying sources for maintenance and repairs, communications about professional tennis such as the San Diego Aviators or community events such as Tennis Fest. Additionally, we inquired if clubs were interested in supporting outreach programs such as the SDDTA Wounded Warrior Tennis Program, wheelchair tennis, autism or other charities or community programs.

The committee expects to continue gathering data from the local clubs and we hope to convene a get-together of tennis club designates in the near future to get the networking started.
