# President's Report By Anne Podney



The San Diego District Tennis Association (SDDTA) has been extremely lucky over the years to recruit board members who are dedicated to this community. Recently, two of our members were honored by the Southern California Tennis Association (SCTA) at its 2018 Service Awards Banquet. Jim Winters received the prestigious Henry Talbert Lifetime Achievement Award. Jim founded the San Diego Tennis Federation in 1983 as an outlet for LGBT competition and has also been a terrific supporter of high school athletics and vari-

ous key USTA initiatives. Amanda Fink was recognized for organizing the Section's College Knowledge program that offers guidance and support for parents of college-bound tennis players. Amanda also heads San Diego's Tennis Fest this June.

Conan Lorenzo, board member and USPTA coach, was recognized by the USTA and awarded the Janet Louer Junior Team Tennis National Organizer of the Year Award. The fantastic growth of the USTA's Junior Team Tennis (JTT) program is a source of pride for many in the San Diego area. Conan stepped in five years ago, and that has made all of the difference. There are currently more than 80 teams competing with approximately 1,400 players in the various divisions, levels, and age groups.

I recently met with Linda Milan and we spoke of the many ways the SCTA and the SDDTA work together. With the grant monies we receive from the SCTA, we are able to do so muchfrom wheelchair tennis to tournament evaluation to the ever popular Tennis Fest. She mentioned that since Youth Tennis San Diego no longer represents junior tennis in San Diego, many newcomers don't know who to call when they are looking for programs or places for their children to play. (The SDDTA only represents adults in San Diego.) We will soon have a link on our website for parents to access junior programs sponsored by the SCTA, including JTT, of course. In the meantime, if you are looking for a pro or clinic for your child visit our website at www.sandiegotennis.com. Under "Clubs" you can find what a club in your area offers.

One more shout-out: Congratulations to the Tennis On Campus (TOC) team from UCSD! UCSD fields one of three teams that will represent Southern California at the USTA National Championships in Surprise, Arizona, April 11-13. There, 64 teams will compete to be the 2019 TOC national champion.

With summer approaching, many of our biggest tournaments are in the offering. For former high school players home for the summer, please note that several tournaments offer discounted entry fees for college players participating in NTRP events. If you were a strong high school player, we look for you to enter at the 5.0 level as we are especially trying to strengthen our 5.0 divisions. See you on the courts!

The San Diego District Tennis Association (SDDTA) Annual Meeting and Awards Banquet was held at the La Jolla Beach & Tennis Club. A sold-out crowd of tennis aficionados enjoyed cocktails and dinner. Linda Milan, Southern California Tennis Association (SCTA) Acting Executive Director, lauded the District for its excellent tennis programs including our annual Tennis Fest which SCTA is now using as a template in other SCTA areas.

Jim Lackritz, a former SDDTA president, introduced the SDDTA honorees recognized for their achievements and contributions to tennis in our community. The Jeff Ray family is the Family of the Year. Jeff and son Jake are a top ranked Father/Son team. Jeff also coaches high school tennis.

Liane Bryson and Taylor Fritz were selected as Players of the Year. Liane had outstanding 2018 tournament success and Taylor continues to excel on the tour. Darice Carnaje and Juan Garcia were named the Female and Male Pro/Coach of the Year. Sportsmanship Awards went to Romeo Matias and Lan Wilhelm.

Jim Winters was given the Community Service Award for his decades of volunteering. He founded the San Diego Tennis Federation in 1983, the first gay organized tennis club in San Diego. Jim taught tennis to juniors and adults at no charge and began a junior tennis program in East San Diego in 2009.

## Warrior Games III: A Successful Tennis Fundraiser

On February 23, San Dieguito Tennis Club (SDTC) hosted a Warrior Games charitable tennis event. It raised over \$7000 to benefit the San Diego District Tennis Association (SDDTA) Wounded Warrior Tennis Program and help fund its 8th Annual National Wounded Warrior Tennis Camp.

Forty Warrior Games participants were split into four teams named for the branches of military service. The teams played a round robin doubles competition and lunched, surrounded by patriotic decor and images of the National Camp in action. Participants and their guests contributed funds through a silent auction and raffle, in addition to player donations.

SDTC member Beth Dammeyer, a member of the National Camp steering committee, spearheaded the Warrior Games effort. Backed by the SDTC Board of Directors, she chaired the organizing committee. Tennis Director Juan Garcia, who served in the U.S. Army's 82nd Airborne Division, ran the on-court activities. The event organizing committee included Mitzi and Bill Brick, Tressa Carol, Suzy Gere, Shari Hume, Josh Jorgensen, Carol Katayama, Laura and Greg King, Diane Krebs, Steve Leffler, Susan Mikschi, Barbara Pasquale, Barbara Rix, and Cheryell Woodworth. Numerous community businesses, club members, and friends rallied to provide generous donation items for the silent auction and raffle.

The SDDTA Wounded Warrior Tennis Program has a track record of service at both the national and local levels. The program is run by a team of volunteers headed by the Wounded Warrior Camp co-founders Steve Kappes, Geoff Griffin, and M.A. Hillier of the SDDTA Military Outreach Committee.

The national level week-long Wounded Warrior Tennis Camp, held at Balboa Tennis Club, provides an all-expense paid experience for 50 wounded, ill, or injured military from across the country. These "wounded warriors" are flown in, put up in a hotel, transported locally, and provided meals and entertainment such as a private tour courtesy of the San Diego Zoo. The message of support for campers is that "we can never do enough" for military in response to their sacrifices in health.

The national camp's mission is to help wounded warriors learn to use tennis as a pathway to rehabilitation and social reintegration. The camaraderie and physicality of tennis can help draw wounded warriors out of isolation, speed healing emotionally and bodily, and build a healthy lifestyle. By supporting the camp and its mission, fundraising participants had the opportunity to help change lives by sharing their love of tennis.

In addition to the national camp, the program provides free weekly tennis clinics followed by social lunches to local wounded warriors at Balboa Tennis Club. The program was recognized with the USTA's 2015 National Adaptive Tennis Community Service Award. More information can be found at www.sdwoundedwarriortennis.org.



## San Diego Players Selected to USA Senior Fed Cup Teams

Debbie Spence-Nasim (Carlsbad) and Ros Nideffer (San Diego) have been named to the USA Maria Bueno Cup team (women's 50+). They will compete on red clay August 4-9 in Estoril, Portugal. Nideffer has been named the playing captain. They were selected from applicants from across the USA based on their 2017-2019 tournament play. Spence-Nasim went undefeated in 2018 playing No.1 singles on the gold medal winning Bueno Cup team in Neu-Ulm, Germany.

Nideffer captained the Bueno Cup team last year and won the 50 Hard Court singles titles in 2017-18 and the doubles in 2018. Both had successful professional tennis careers.

Robin Harris (San Diego) and Carolyn Nichols (Rancho Santa Fe) have been named to the USA Alice Marble Cup team (women's 60+). Nichols has been selected to captain the team, which finished second in 2018 in Ulm, Germany. Harris and Nichols were finalists at the world championships in 2018 and are three-time defending champions at the 60 Hard Court nationals. Nichols is a three-time defending champion in 60 clay doubles and ranked No.1 by the ITF currently in 60 singles and doubles.



# Rainy Miller Wins Two Titles in ITF Regional Championship in Miami

Rainy Miller (Poway) is branching out from local leagues and tournaments to national and international play. This year she won the ITF 55 doubles and mixed at the ITF Regional Championships in Miami Beach, which is the second highest point tournament level on the ITF Seniors circuit. She also reached the semis of the Wilson/Mission Hills and placed third at Lamita Jabour Grandes Dames tournament in Fort Lauderdale, while reaching the quarters at the National Clay Courts in Houston. She is currently sitting at No. 28 in doubles and No. 30 in mixed in the ITF world rankings. Rainy gives credit to Tole (2018 San Diego District Pro of the Year) and her husband (who encouraged her to compete) for giving her the confidence to travel and compete.


